The Cronmiller outbuilding is a 10' by 20' one story structure in deteriorated condition. The structure sits on cinder block footers, the foundation has shifted and the building is falling off the footers. The structure is clad with German lap siding. The gabled roof is covered with composition shingles. There is a brick chimney on the exterior of the north wall.

The one room interior is gutted.

The structure is the only remaining element of a complex containing a residential building and several outbuildings. The building is of utilitarian design. The building is in very poor condition.

The building was located on the Conmiller tract that was purchased by the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers in 1988. The building was part of a complex that contained a dwelling and several outbuildings. The house was destroyed by fire and the other outbuildings have been demolished. The remaining structure is of no historic or architectural significance.

The Cronmiller outbuilding does not meet any of the criteria of historic significance for listing on the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties. The structure is not associated with any significant historic events or historic people, it is not distinctive in design nor is it the work of a master. An archeological survey in the area showed no potential to provide information about history or prehistory.

The outbuilding was part of a complex of residential and support buildings. It is the only surviving structure of this complex and therefore lacks integrity of setting, feeling and association since the companion structures are no longer standing. The design and workmanship while still intact are not significant. With the loss of the other structures in the complex the surviving building lacks the context of the original setting.


