

Second oldest house on this block after No. 11. A fine example of a "Victorian" house - a long thin house that is mostly façade. Front is 2 storeys plus mansard on 3rd storey. Mansard is shingle (scalloped) painted to look like slate - there are 2 dormers projecting; below mansard is fine modillion and bracket cornice. 1st and 2nd storey windows have shutters (louvred) - 1st storey porch with columns - stone base - sidewalk cobbled. Possibly built by same person who did Nos. 97, 99 Cathedral. A fine building by itself No 1 is important visually, it is on the corner and acts as a definite ending spot for "Federal" style houses on Cathedral.





