





<p>These three buildings (and also No.s. 14 and 16) are covered up by modern siding, however, their shapes show that they may be of great interest. Built by Negro families, Nos. 22 and 26 have central roof chimney and 6/6 triangular roof dormers. All three have identical simple wood cornices and all have 6/6 windows. No. 24 has a Greek doorway and looks more Greek than its neighbors. (14 and 16 may be even older) Worth research and age and scale makes these buildings important to block.</p>
