DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

79 College Avenue is a contemporary recreation of a Mid-Georgian, Maryland dependency (e.g. Paca House or the hyphens at Brice House) constricted to a triangularly shaped plot. 79 College is 1½ stories, built of brick (Flemish bond), and has an external end chimney. On the street (main) front there are three 6/6 windows with iron 'balconies' attached to them; there are three dormer windows (with 4/4) directly above. The house is entered through a door on the end wall next to the chimney. Because of the nature of the plot, the rear of the house looks as though it once were identical to the front half but had been folded over and squished in to fit the lot.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

The attempt to recreate a small version of a Mid-18th c. Maryland dependency was thwarted from the outset by the unusual shape of the lot. Despite the failure to achieve this end, 79 College Avenue does make fairly good use of this rather small space. This house does, however, serve as a reminder of the uniqueness and importance to Annapolis of its early town plan. It is surprising that such triangles are not more in evidence considering Annapolis's semi-Baroque plan — this plan has resulted in the visual excitement that is the genius of the city.




