Restored to late 18th-early 19thC appearance, with corbeled cornice, splayed brick arches at windows and all doors, the main entrance with double door and flat transom; end wall chimney; loading doors in southwest end wall.



Excellent restoration of a warehouse that replaced the Warehouse of the Victually Office confiscated from Daniel Dulaney, Loyalist; excellent example of vernacular building, critical to streetscape and of historic importance.

4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **no**

Original warehouse and/or tenement of Daniel Dulaney; used as victualling office during Revolution. Interior gutted by fire in 1807, rebuilt same year. End walls and chimneys are original and possibly the front and back walls. Windows and 1st floor have been altered, however three roof dormers, triangular with returns (6/6), show how handsome building used to be. Located at an important point, this building should definitely be restored. H and Sports and Specialties with their matching end chimneys and height visually define this block. Historically and architecturally too important to lose. (Would be ideal commercial location).





