

### **Capsule Summary of 110 Main Street (AA-540)**

Originally constructed as a commercial building, 110 Main Street was built in the years between 1872 and 1885. Sited on property known as the Market House Lot, the building was constructed by Martin Smith, who's family owned the building until 1973. The building stands as an important reminder of typical commercial architecture of the late 19th and early 20th centuries in the Annapolis Historic District.

The three-story, two-bay building is constructed of brick, laid in five-course American bond, is covered with a sloped roof and features window moldings with Italianate details. It is located on the northeast side of Main Street between Hydes Alley and Market Square and is attached on the southeast side. A narrow alley on the northwest separates it from its neighbor at 112-114 Main Street. The building features an altered first story storefront and has a two additions abutting the rear elevation.

Constructed between 1872 and 1885, the building at 110 Main Street is a three-story, two-bay building. The building is constructed of brick, laid in five-course American bond, is covered with a sloped roof and features window moldings with Italianate details. It is located on the northeast side of Main Street between Hydes Alley and Market Square and is attached on the southeast side. A narrow alley on the northwest separates it from its neighbor at 112-114 Main Street. The building features an altered first story storefront and has a two additions abutting the rear elevation.

The southwest front elevation faces Main Street and consists of a storefront on the first story and two bays of windows on the second and third stories. The storefront is designed in a ca. 1940 Colonial Revival style and extends across the first story of the attached building at 108 Main Street. It is constructed of all-stretcher brick, appended to the original brick wall, but flush with it, and has a side-passage door and a 9-light fixed show window. The side-passage entry has a nine-light cross-panel wood door with narrow wood pilasters on either side. The show window has a wood frame surround. The entire storefront, extending across 108 and 110 Main Street, is covered with a shed roof with slate tiles.

The second and third stories are divided into two bays of windows, where the third story windows are longer than the second story windows.<sup>1</sup> The second story windows are set within recessed reveals and have 6/6 sash with flat wood trim and a bracketed hood moldings. The hood moldings consist of two end brackets with fluting supporting a box cornice with a projecting cyma recta molding above. The third story windows lack the hood moldings, but share similar flat wood surrounds with a slightly projecting architrave at the top. Like the second story windows, these 6/6 sash are set within recessed reveals.

Unlike the elaborately-treated second story windows, the cornice line of this building lacks the typical Italianate-styled bracketed wood cornice. The cornice, here, consists of two simple rows of projecting bricks dividing a row of bricks laid in a soldier course

pattern.<sup>2</sup>

The northwest side elevation is not accessible; a brick infill addition which houses a stairwell leading to the upper stories encloses the first story of the alley which historically separated 110 from 112-114 Main Street. From the public domain, however, it appears that a single 6/6 window is located on this brick wall surface.

Together with the building located at 108 Main Street, the first floor interior was renovated in 1991. Any surviving historic elements were replaced at that time with contemporary detailing and counter space. The second floor, presently not in use, was not surveyed.

Originally constructed as a commercial building, 110 Main Street was built in the years between 1872 and 1885. Sited on property known as the Market House Lot, the building was constructed by Martin Smith, who's family owned the building until 1973. The building stands as an important reminder of typical commercial architecture of the late 19th and early 20th centuries in the Annapolis Historic District.

The building at 110 Main Street is sited on the original Market Square property, which dates from 1728. In 1752 the Market House and lot were sold to Lancelot Jacques, who operated a store on a portion of the lot fronting on the dock.<sup>3</sup> In 1775, Jacques sold the portion located to the northwest of Hyde's Alley to Charles Steuart.<sup>4</sup> The parcel where 130-132-134 Main Street is currently located was sold by Jacques to Joseph Dowson in 1782 for L300.<sup>5</sup> The southern-most section of the lot between Market Spcae and Hyde's Alley, containing 110 Main Street, was conveyed in 1783 to Jacob Hurst for L1105. According to the deed of sale, the property contained "...a store house in the occupation of Hurst."<sup>6</sup>

Within a year Hurst conveyed his small section of the lot to Joseph Dowson for L100, retaining the property containing the store house (probably 42 Market Space).<sup>7</sup> Dowson conveyed a portion of the property to prominent merchant and builder of the State House, Charles Wallace in 1790, while leasing the remaining property to Paul Richards, a hairdresser, for L9 per annum.<sup>8</sup> In four years time, the lease was purchased by Seth Sweetser, who also purchased the Wallace property.<sup>9</sup>

At the mid- to late 19th century, the large lot which extended to Cornhill Street was purchased by Martin Smith. Martin M. Smith, born in Germany on February 2, 1843, came to the Washington, DC area in 1860. Smith, following his relocation to Annapolis in 1863, operated a bakery and confectionery at 130-132-134 Main Street. In July 1867, he married his brother's widow, Catharina (Peters) Smith, who was born about 1839.<sup>10</sup> Smith continued to live in the portion of the building known as 130-132 Main Street, while operating a bakery at 134 Main Street. According to the census records for 1880, Martin Smith lived with his large family on Main Street, and rented rooms to four of his bakery employees. In 1905, Smith conveyed 110 Main Street to his son, Rudolph R. Smith, who was currently in the process of constructing a building at 108 Main Street.

Rudolph R. Smith, born about 1871, constructed the building located at 108 Main Street by 1908. The Sanborn maps for 1908 indicate that the building at 108 was leased as a clothing store, while Smith operated a drug store at 110 Main Street. Smith died in 1914, bequeathing the property to his son, Rudolph Martin John Smith. Smith, Jr., a graduate of George Washington University Scholl of Pharmacy, continued to manage the drugs store at 110 Main Street, referred to in the city directory of 1928-1929 as The R.R. Smith Pharmacy.<sup>11</sup>

By 1954, the Smith Pharmacy relocated to 108 Main Street, leasing 110 Main Street to W.R. Chance and Sons Jewelers. The Smith family retained ownership of the two buildings until 1973. Following recent renovations on the first floor, the building at 108 and 110 Main Street are owned and operated by the W.R. Chance and Sons Jewelers. The second floor is not presently used.




