

NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC no</p> <p>One of the earliest structures on Market Street, 138 is a narrow house that extends to the rear in three additions. The street facade has 4 windows (6/6), 2 on each floor, a brick base (3 courses), a simple wood cornice, and a metal roof with one chimney (new). The entrance is on the garden side toward 134 Market. The other side, along an alley has a fine Greek doorway and 13 (6/6) shuttered windows, plus 3 (6/3) attic windows. Fine example of Greek Revival town.house.</p> <p>138 Market Street is an integral part of the contiguous streetscape and its removal would virtually destroy this part of the street visually, as 138 occupies a key position.
