

CAPSULE SUMMARY
Pythias Castle (AA-649)
7-13 School Street
Annapolis, Maryland

The two-story building at 7-13 School Street was constructed in 1895 by the Friendship Lodge #8, Knights of Pythias as their primary meeting hall. The Fraternal Order of Knights of Pythias and its international non-sectarian members are dedicated to the cause of universal peace. The distinguishing principles of the Order -- Friendship, Charity and Benevolence -- are seen on the exterior of the Annapolis lodge within a large medallion marked with the letters: F C B. The brick building was used by a number of society groups, with commercial office space on the first floor. The Knights of Pythias owned and occupied Pythias Castle for seventy-seven years, selling it in 1969.

Despite a change in use, the building retains much of the applied architectural ornamentation that reflected its use as a society hall. The large buff brick building at 7-13 School Street sets itself apart from the older buildings on School Street and in Annapolis for its use of large, arched openings and implied columns, designed in an Italian Renaissance Revival style.

The large buff colored brick building at 7-13 School Street was built in 1895 as a combination office building and social hall. It distinguishes itself from the other late 19th century buildings in Annapolis with its bold display of arched openings that characterize the Italian Renaissance Revival style.

The building is a two-story brick structure covered with a gable roof. The north elevation, facing School Street is clad with a buff face brick, laid in all-stretcher bond. The side walls, constructed of red brick, are laid in a six-course American bond. The facade is divided into three principal bays, defined by large arched openings on both the first and second stories. The three, large openings on the first story are set into brick panels that are separated from each other by brick pilasters. Each of the three arched openings is filled with a single door and window, with a half-round transom filling in the arch. The doors originally opened into individual offices. A fourth opening on this first story, located in the east end bay, has a side-passage entry leading to the stair hall and second floor of the structure. This opening has a double wood and glass door and a large transom, with a molded limestone architrave.

Above the first story openings, separated from the second story, are the brick stringcourse and friezeboard. This frieze is currently embellished with the name of the organization occupying the building: AFLCIO. The second story windows rise above this frieze, separated from it by a stone stringcourse. The three second-story arches are fully rounded, with openings holding a tripartite arrangement of windows set beneath an oversized fanlight. The wood window mullions and stiles have incised detailing, and the sun of the fanlight is painted with gold-gilt letters, reading from left to right, F C B. Between each arch, in the spandrel, are stone or terra cotta rondels. These rondels are decorated with Byzantine crosses, symbolic of the social order which met in this second-story space.

The east end bay of the second story, above the first story stair entry, is a large marble crest with a knight in armor. On the armor is carved, in relief, the letters F C B. Above the second story arches is a wide frieze and cornice. The frieze is made of brick, several rows of which are rusticated to give it a three-part effect. The cornice has dentils and supports a copper gutter.

The east end wall is brick, laid in six-course American bond. It has no openings in its exposed surface.

Site History

The property on which 7-13 School Street stands is a portion of Lot 73, which was owned in the 1720s by Margaret Steele. The triangular lot included 7-23 School Street and 220-238 Main Street. Following the subdivision of the lot in the mid-18th century, the northernmost portion of property fronting Church Circle at the corners of Main and School Streets was first leased, then owned, by the saddler and farmer, Nathan Waters. The 1765 deed of conveyance from then-owner William Paca to Waters records the existence of several dwelling houses. Immediately upon purchasing the northern portion of Lot 73, Waters began to subdivide it into smaller parcels. By 1774, the parcel later denoted as 7-13 School Street was conveyed to Water's granddaughter, Elizabeth McClellan Chisholm for 174 pounds sterling. The sale included 35-1/2 feet fronting School Street, with dwellings then occupied by Denis Dulaney.

Upon the death of Chisholm, the School Street property was devised to her grandson, John Wilmot, Jr. (13 School Street) and daughter Anne C. Wilmot (7-9 School Street). Despite the division in ownership between the heirs of Chisholm, the property remained in the family throughout the 19th century. In 1831, Ann Wilmot was charged with a single lot with improvements valued at \$600. In the 1849 assessments, the same lot was assessed at \$450. By 1860, the property, now owned and occupied by Emily Wilmot, contained one of four dwellings fronting School Street. Historic maps indicate a building, presumably the one-and-a-half-story Wilmot house at 13-15 School Street, was extant in the late 1870s.

Building History

In 1887, the property was conveyed in two separate deeds to Elizabeth Feldmeyer by Cornelia Millburn and Anne Brewer, both descendants of Emily Wilmot. The sale of 7-13 School Street in 1887 ended the 118 year ownership of descendants of Nathan Waters. Elizabeth Feldmeyer, together with husband Charles G. Feldmeyer, retained ownership for five years. It was sold in 1892 to the Friendship Lodge #8, Knights of Pythias of the City of Annapolis for \$800.

The tax assessments document that the brick dwelling previously occupied by the Wilmot family was razed in 1893, replaced by a two-story brick building in 1895. The new structure was erected by the Knights of Pythias as their primary meeting hall. It was valued at \$4000 in 1895. Founded in Washington, D.C. by Justus H. Rathbone, the Order of Knights of Pythias was chartered under an act of Congress in 1864. The Fraternal Order of Knights of Pythias and its international non-sectarian members were dedicated to the cause of universal peace. The distinguishing principles of the Order -- Friendship, Charity and Benevolence -- are seen on the exterior of the Annapolis lodge at 7-13 School Street within a large medallion marked with the letters: F C B.¹

The Friendship Lodge #8 had their society hall on the second floor of the building at 7-13 School Street, while the first floor was leased as office space. The 1924 city directory shows that typically insurance agents and real estate agents leased the commercial office space. The upper stories of the meeting hall were utilized by the Independent Order of Mechanics, State Capital Lodge #22, by the Order of the Maccabees, Women's Benefit Association, and by the Knights of Pythias. In fact, the building was referred to as the Pythian Castle in the city directory.

Relocating to Edgewater, Maryland, the Knights of Pythias sold the building at 7-13 School Street to the Annapolis Banking and Trust Company in 1969. The city directory for the years between 1969 and 1975 indicate the building was vacant until purchased by Zane Roberts in August 1975. It was sold one year later to Nicholas N. Krittrics. Renovated on the interior for use as offices, Pythian



Brick corbeled cornice, string course at second floor; facade divided into four bays with large round arched tripartite windows with full fans at second floor, second through fourth bays, the first bay enriched by a carved cartouche; spandrels at round headed windows decorated with carved patera; first floor has transom lit entrance at first bay with limestone architrave trim, the three bays to the right with elliptical arched openings divided by vertical mullions above a molded transom bar, the lower part consisting of a 1/1 window with paneled spandrel, and a glass paneled door.



This yellow brick building shares height and cornice with Hays Building (No.15) and serves as visual break between State and Church Circle. 1st floor has law office, 2nd floor Knight of Pythias hall- @ has 3 bays - 2nd floor reminiscent of Chiswick Garden front (see Post Office - Church Circle), 3 arches - see photo, which are echoed in 3 less elaborate arches on 1st floor. These bays are offset by doorway on left (to upstairs) - above it is an FCB crest - trophy. The yellow brick is a facade- red brick on side of building. Modillioned cornice, tiny dentil-like modillions on windows - various molded brick protrusions show care in detailing, etc.
