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MAIN BLOCK WITH PEDIMENTED CROSS GABLE, OVAL WINDOW IN GABLE, MOLDED CORNICE AND RAKES, BREAKING ACROSS PROJECTING ENTRANCE PAVILLION. SECOND FLOOR WINDOWS ELLIPTICAL ARCHED, FIRST WITH SPLAYED BRICK FLAT ARCHES, ENTRANCE WITH FULL ENTABLATURE AND EXCEPTIONAL "WELCOMING ARMS" STAIR. LEFT WING THREE STORIES WITH HIPPED ROOF, MOLDED CORNICE, ROUND ARCHED WINDOWS AT THIRD FLOOR, ELLIPTICAL AT SECOND, SPLAYED FLAT ARCHED AT FIRST, WITH ENTRANCE AT LEFT SIDE ELEVATION. BADLY REPOINTED AND SANDBLASTED.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

EDWARD DORSEY HOUSE, C.1695, ONE OF THREE BRICK RESIDENCES IN TOWN WHEN CAPITAL MOVED HERE FROM ST. MARYS. RESIDENCE OF GOVERNOR FRANCIS NICHOLSON 1694-1709. EXCEPTIONAL LATE, 17THC RESIDENCE UNFORTUNATELY MARRED BY SANDBLASTING AND POOR POINTING. IMPORTANT AS A TYPE, INCLUDING VILLA WING TO SOUTH, AND CRITICAL TO STREETScape.

Interesting is a "Welcoming Arms" stairway at the entrance. Central pediment projects slightly. 3 story addition was built after the Civil War. The bricks have been painted gray. The shutters do not fit the scale of the house and probably were a later addition. One of the three brick houses in Annapolis when the capital moved here from St. Marys. Governor Francis Nicholson lived here from 1694-1709. It is believed that the Assembly met in the house in 1695.</p>



The main block is early Georgian and was quite advanced for its time. Flemish bond and belt courses are from this period. The house was later Greek-icized, but quite nicely so, (the house is a good Greek example) with enlarged windows. Early pediment adapted itself to this. Horseshoe staircase and very fine period door (like Dorsey Carriage House) are excellent Greek features. 3 storey Italianate wing was added in about 1870s. Its evolution makes this an interesting house; it should be a first priority for permanent preservation.</p>


