



4. NOTABLE FEATURES, HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE AND DESCRIPTION OPEN TO PUBLIC **no**

232 and 248 Prince George Street are both fairly typical urban Victorian buildings for Annapolis - the standard 3 bay, 3 storey, red brick, fairly elegant structures with rich period cornices. Practically identical, 232 has flat topped windows with splayed brick lintels, while 248 has brick arched windows. These buildings are right scale and material and add to street - good period pieces - both should be saved. (Others of type, 137 Charles, 194 Prince George, etc.) 36 Maryland Avenue is another version of this; probably all built by same builder.


