

**Capsule Summary for 64 State Circle
AA-693**

Built in the period between 1844-1854, the building at 64 State Circle is located on property that was originally part of the large tract of land associated with the home of the Honorable Charles Calvert, governor of Maryland from 1720 to 1727. During the early-to-mid 19th century, this large tract of land was developed by the construction of both residential and commercial structures. The building at 64 State Circle was constructed in the early part of the 19th century and provides a good illustration of the growth of the city from its 18th century origins of large and prominent estates to the more densely built 19th century Annapolis.

The vernacular building at 64 State Circle is an unpretentious, one-story frame structure constructed of wide wood weatherboard with a gable roof. The facade and side elevations are constructed of wide weatherboard and cornerboards, while the rear additions are constructed of a narrower weatherboard with a slanting roof. The front elevation, measuring 15 feet in width, is two bays wide and features a side-passage entry door at the southwest corner. A projecting bay window was installed where the single 6/6 window originally existed.¹ The gable roof, with a boxed cornice, slopes to the rear of the building, extending over the ell addition that dates from early 1910s. The existing asphalt shingle roof, installed in the late 1970s, covers a standing seam metal roof. A corbel capped brick chimney is sited slightly to the south of the gable crest.

Located on the eastern side of State Circle, the building at 64 State Circle was constructed between the years 1844 and 1854 as a one-story, detached frame structure as an office. The one-story commercial building is smaller in size and scale to the other commercial/residential buildings on the block but was constructed at an earlier time period. The front elevation faces State Circle, while the rear elevation extends to the rear of those buildings fronting on the southeast side of Maryland Avenue. The southeast elevation is separated from its neighbor at 58 State Circle by a eight-foot passageway leading to the rear of the property, where an two-story dwelling stands. The northwest elevation is separated by an eight-foot passageway leading to the rear of 66 State Circle.

The vernacular building at 64 State Circle is an unpretentious, one-story frame structure constructed of wide wood weatherboard with a gable roof. The facade and side elevations are constructed of wide weatherboard and cornerboards, while the rear additions are constructed of a narrower weatherboard with a slanting roof. The front elevation, measuring 15 feet in width, is two bays wide and features a side-passage entry door at the southwest corner. A projecting bay window was installed where the single 6/6 window originally existed.¹ The gable roof, with a boxed cornice, slopes to the rear of the building, extending over the ell addition that dates from early 1910s. The existing asphalt shingle roof, installed in the late 1970s, covers a standing seam metal roof. A corbel capped brick chimney is sited slightly to the south of the gable crest.

When originally constructed between the years 1844 and 1854, the one-story frame building contained one room with a central fireplace. The building, used as a business office and then a dentist's office, suffered sever fire damage sometime between the years 1908 and 1913.² After the fire, renovations occurred and the

rear ell was added.³ In the late 1970s, the current owners added a rear addition to the building. The wood frame addition has a sloping roof and full basement.

The front elevation features a side-passage entry with a nine-light and two panel door. The entry features beaded trim and is covered by a shed roof supported with X-brackets. A projecting square bay window, with a single pane of glass, is supported by two brackets and covered by a hipped roof.

The southeast elevation of the building, approximately 90 feet in depth, has one original 6/6 window with a plain projecting lintel and sill. The second bay on the side elevation has a double 10-light casement window, while the third bay of the 1913 ell has a single 6-light casement window. The 1970s addition has a single 1/1 window and a four panel wood door leading to the basement.

The northwest elevation has two 6-light awning windows and a 6-light casement window, all with plain projecting lintels and sills. The northern elevation of the 1970s addition is a solid wall of wood weatherboard.

The interior of the 64 State Circle is comprised of single narrow room, running the length of the building. The original gable-roofed structure contains few historic elements. The fireplace openings and mantles, if any ever existed, have been removed and the brick chimney has been surrounded by drywall. The floors have been carpeted and the ceiling has been covered with particle board. The lighting is all replacement florescent lighting. The baseboard has a double beaded trim on the northern wall and single beaded trim on the southern wall. The crown molding is a single bead with reeding. The window and door trim throughout the building have been replaced with plain block trim.

The rear 1970s addition has a sloping roof with clerestory windows above the point of connection of the 1913 and 1970s addition. A small office space, spanning the width of the building, has been created at the rear of the addition. A wall, standing approximately 6 feet in height, provides necessary privacy. To the east, within the office space, is a door leading to a straight

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flight of enclosed stairs. The stairs extend to the basement apartment that runs the length of the 1970s addition. A crawl space exists under the 1913 addition. When the furnace was relocated under the building in the 1970s, 18 tons of dirt were removed and a square brick foundation was uncovered.⁴

On the rear of the property is a detached two-story, eight-course American bond brick building. The building, originally 9 feet by 10 feet, was constructed in the early 1910s with bricks and windows removed from the octagonal annex building that was being demolished on the State House grounds. The building was used as a private library until it was renovated for use as an apartment in the 1980s. A brick addition, with one wall of glass and wood, has been added to the southern corner. The rounded casement windows have been replaced due to deterioration.

During the relocation of the furnace in the basement, a gas light fixture was uncovered. The metal light, declared to be the only remaining original gas light to survive of those which once encircled State House Circle, has raised lettering: "James Bates, Baltimore" on the shaft. The gas light, renovated for current use, has been installed along the brick walkway on the southeastern side of the property with underground wiring.

The building at 64 State Circle was constructed in the early part of the 19th century and provides a good illustration of the growth of the city from its 18th century origins of large and prominent estates to the more densely built 19th century Annapolis.

Designated as part of lot 82 and all of lot 83 on the Stoddert Map of 1718, the Calvert property originally was bounded by Maryland Avenue, State Circle and East Street. Governor Charles Calvert purchased the property after his term as governor was finished. The large brick dwelling, now the Governor Calvert Hotel, was constructed in the 1720s and altered over the years. The Calvert family owned the property until 1810, when Governor Charles Calvert's grandson, Edward Henry Calvert sold it to Robert Denney. According to the tax assessment records of 1798, the two lots contained only a two-story brick dwelling. However, when Robert Denney purchased the property in 1810, the deed of sale listed the conveyance of "part of lot 82, all of lot 83, other buildings, and houses."⁵ In 1819, all of the Denney property was sold to Jonas Green, grandson of Jonas Green, who revived the Maryland Gazette and was printer to the colony of Maryland. Jonas Green, the grandson and also a printer, subsequently sold the property to Robert Welch of Ben in 1842.

Dr. Abram Claude purchased the property from Welch in 1854. Dr. Abram Claude was the grandson of a watchmaker from Switzerland and son of Dr. Dennis Claude, who served as the Mayor of Annapolis (1828-1836 and 1853) and State Treasurer (1854-1860). Abram Claude was born in Anne Arundel County on December 4, 1818. He attended St. John's College in 1838. A physician by profession, he served as Mayor in 1847-1850, 1854, 1867-1868, and 1883-1889. During the years 1871 and 1883 he was a professor of natural sciences at St. John's College. Between 1895 and 1899, Abram Claude was postmaster. Abram and Rachel Ann Tuck Claude were the parents of

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seven children.⁶

During Abram Claude's ownership of the Calvert house, he renovated the two-story brick dwelling, creating a three-story on a raised basement, brick dwelling. He used the existing frame building, located to the northwest of the dwelling as a physician's office. The mortgage for the property, between Welch and Claude, states the existence of "a frame office, large three-story and attic house, a two story and attic brick building at corner of East Street, now used as a school house, frame stable and two other frame buildings, used as carpenters shops."⁷

In 1889, Abram Claude sold parcel 960 for \$1,000 to Dr. Gordon Handy Claude, Abram's third eldest child.⁸ Dr. Gordon Claude, born in 1854, was Lieutenant in the United States Navy, having graduated from the Naval Academy in 1878. A veteran of World War I, Gordon Claude attended the University of Maryland Medical School and the Baltimore College of Dental Surgery. Following in the family tradition, he served as Mayor of Annapolis in 1907 to 1909. He and his wife, Sophia Muse Worthington Claude, had ten children. Dr. Gordon used the building located at 64 State Circle as his dental office until his death in 1940. When the building suffered fire damage in 1913, Dr. Claude renovated and added the rear ell. During this same time period, the octagonal annex on the State House grounds was being demolished and Dr. Claude acquired the rounded windows and brick. The windows and some of the many bricks were used to construct a private library for himself in the rear of the property at 64 State Circle. Claude removed hundreds more bricks than needed and subsequently the ground surrounding both building on the site was covered with bricks.

Dr. Gordon Claude willed his property to ten children, who reconveyed it to their mother.⁹ Upon her death, Sophia Muse

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Worthington Claude willed it to Caroline Claude Cobb and Winifred Claude Gordon.¹⁰ The fourth child of the Gordon Claude, Anne Lee Fitzhugh Claude Lovell, received the property located at 64 State Circle from her sisters Caroline Claude Cobb and Winifred Claude Gordon in 1966.¹¹ According to the City Directories for 1928-1929, the building was occupied by Myers Gift Mart. By 1949, the City Directories state that Herff-Jones Academy Shop occupied 64 State Circle. The Historic Annapolis Inc. was located in the building in 1954, as stated in the City Directories.

Anne Lee Fitzhugh Claude Lovell, born in 1894, was a nurse who married James Harry Lovell of Buckinghamshire, England. Mr. Lovell worked as an engineer director for the Indian Railways and died in 1950 at the age of 76. In 1969, Anne Lee Lovell conveyed the property to her daughter, Mary Dulany Claude Lovell Dierdorff.¹² Mrs. Dierdorff and her husband, Ross Ainworth Dierdorff, Jr., are the current owners and lease the property. Currently, it is occupied by "The Salt Box," a clothing shop for women.






Behind the Claude Office is a Gothic Revival outbuilding of about 1850, which is rather interesting; some research needed on this structure as to correct date, builder, etc.


