

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL OR STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

AA-697

Molded wood cornice surrounds entire hip roof; jack arches at all windows and door, brick belt course at second and third floor, watertable (granite); 6/6 sash at all windows, but window heights lessen as they rise; first floor windows now floor length c. 1840; transom lit entrance with tall, narrow sidelights, granite stairs; cast iron grilles at mid 19thC first floor windows.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE:

Excellent Georgian townhouse, originally intended to be one of a pair (west wall blind as party wall) with careful Greek Revival alterations (first floor windows, transom.) Historic importance as possible birthplace of William Pinkney and as residence of the last Chancellor of Maryland, John Johnson, Jr. Focal point of this end of West St.

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

One of Annapolis' finest houses and stylistically one of the most important. It is an outstanding example of Federal architecture. Everything from the slate roof to the granite basement windows appears original. All windows are 6/6, however, the length of the panes are longer on the 1st storey, and almost square on 3rd floor. Fine brick work - splayed lintels, belt courses and so forth. 6 panel door with 4 light transom and long narrow (c.2" wide) side lights 2/2. Original granite steps- also original sash and glass! All windows have inside shutters. Much of interior woodwork, chair rails, etc. is intact. A superb piece of American architecture - good representational piece. (Flemish bond)
