Parts of the large, rambling house, located at 1401 Odenton Road in Odenton, are said to date to the 1860s. However, its current appearance is in large part established by additions and alterations dating to 1881 and later. The resulting picturesque combination of stylistic elements, rooflines, porches and bays is characteristic of the eclectic architecture of the late 19th century. Located within the Odenton Survey District (AA-869), the Watts House is an Odenton Landmark which lends visual distinction to the station area. It is an unusually intact example of late 19th century eclecticism for this part of Anne Arundel County. It is particularly distinguished by the multiplicity of roof types it exhibits. The size and location of the Watts House, adjacent to the Odenton railroad station, suggest that it may have served as a boarding house or hotel. Further investigation is required to confirm this supposition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The dwelling is on the west side of the Conrail tracks, across from the passenger shelter. It is reached by crossing over the rail road tracks on Rt. 175 and taking Lokus or Morgan Rd. south to Odenton Rd.

The dwelling displays a combination of styles, rooflines, porches and bays. The main block, facing north, is two stories high on a low ironstone foundation. It has a gable roof with a center gable and a large pentagonal bay on the west side. On the east elevation, between the main block and the two-and-half story wing on the rear is another pentagonal bay which is plainer and narrower than the one on the front. The wing, having a gambrel roof with dormers and end chimneys is, curiously, only two bays wide. A connected summer kitchen on the west elevation completes the assemblage. All sections of the dwelling are covered with German siding, and are painted white with green trim.

A seven bay veranda extends across the front ~~of the~~ and wraps around the east elevation of the main block. The porch has a low shed roof supported by turned posts with curved brackets, perforated by floral designs, and a Chinese lattice railing. The above grade entrance porch on the wing's east elevation has plain posts, perforated brackets and railing.

The main entrance is in the center bay of the front (north) elevation. It has a three light transom above a four panel door.

Windows through^{out} the house contain 2/2 light sash. A small oculus with four lights in it is centered below the front gable.

The main block has a gable roof with overhanging eaves and a plain fascia board. It is covered, as are all the roofs, with slate. A small interior end chimney is on the west side of the roof. The pentagonal bay on the front has a conical slate roof with a copper knob on top. The roof of the pentagonal bay on the east elevation is flattened. As noted before, the wing has a gambrel roof with a steeply pitched lower section and wide eaves. The dormers are faced with imbricated shingles and the exterior chimneys have corbelled caps.

The house, surrounded by a hedge in some sections, sits on an acre of land. It is right next to the railroad tracks. Both the regular Conrail and Metroliner go through approximately 50 feet from the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

An eclectic blend, the Watts House has a distinctly late 19th century (Carpenter Gothic) appearance, although it is believed that some of the main block and the wing were built prior to 1865. The owner has done research on the property which shows that Nathan Peter Watts sold land to the Baltimore and Potomac Railway in 1867, and that a house of similar plan to this one is shown on the railway's survey of 1867. The massing, scale, fenestration and sheathing of the house suggests that it was "finished" in the 1880's or 90's, and the wing appears to have been influenced by the Colonial Revival. The dwelling seen from the train or across the tracks is an Odenton landmark, lending distinction to the area around the train station. It is unusual to find a late 19th century dwelling such as this one with its original porch, octagonal bays and decorative mill work intact. In addition, the combination of roof lines must be unique in Anne Arundel County.
