DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 2 1/2 story frame house is five bays wide by one bay deep and faces south. The entrance is located in the central bay of the south facade, with two 6/6 sash windows on either side. Four 6/6 sash are arrayed across the second story, aligned above the first-floor windows. A one-story shed-roofed porch with plain squared posts spans the facade. The cornice is boxed; a corbeled brick chimney rises from the east gable end, while the west gable has a single 6/6 window centered on each floor, and a 6-pane casement in the attic. A full-height, one-bay gabled ell extends to the north, its west wall continuous with that of the main block. The house is clad in novelty siding, with asphalt shingles covering the roof.


