It is a large, two storey colonial style house with an enclosed porch encircling four views. The house is a striking piece of architecture by its own merits and it also contributes to the development of an architectural design theme in this black town.

**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Burwell House is a large two storey colonial cottage. It has an exterior chimney and is constructed of wood frame resting on a pier foundation. It has an L-shaped plan with a corresponding enclosed porch which encircles all views. A room has been added to the second storey and the house is finished with clapboard siding with contrasting trims.

The Burwell House is located in Highland Beach, Maryland in a block that is bounded by Bay Avenue on the north, Bruce Avenue towards the east, Douglass Avenue on the south, and Walnut Drive on the west. The house is situated on lot with sparse but large vegetation. It is on a large corner lot and lies about ten miles southeast of Annapolis.

The Burwell House rests upon a high, pier foundation which is camouflaged by an extensive latticework boarding. The northern and eastern views are almost identical on the first storey. The house is entered by a rectangular doorway at the top of four steps. The porch on the northern view is about twelve bays wide and enclosed with screening. Doric columns can be observed on the interior of the screened porch. These columns support the shed roof on this house. The facade of the northern view is two bays wide and houses windows that are double hung with six lights and a pane.

The second storey of the eastern side exhibits an exterior brick chimney. The roof line is varied in this view where the shed roof dormer, the slope of the mid section of the house, and the gable end of the principal wing of the house can be seen. Double hung windows are discernible on this two bay facade. Two windows flank the chimney suggesting that the windows and the chimney were constructed at the same time. The four windows on the second storey of the northern view are symmetrically placed on this facade. The eave of the gable is extended beyond the trim of the windows on this house.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Highland Beach, Maryland is a historic black town that was founded by the son of Frederick Douglass. The town was conceived by Haley R. Douglass to be resort community in the late nineteenth century for prominent blacks. Highland Beach is a unique, existing reminder of town planning and architectural history as it relates to vernacular and high style design exhibited by black people. Most of the architecture in Highland Beach is located on the original sites and building expansions took place within a ten to fifteen year time frame. This town provides us with a concise history of design, space planning, and architecture in a homogeneous, extant community.

The Burwell Cottage was once owned by Charles Douglass, the son of Frederick Douglass. It exhibits a style of architecture, the colonial, that was replicated by a few other homes in the community. It is one of the three original houses in the settlement and thereby contributes to the establishment of a design theme as well as a standard of quality in the community. The exact date of construction is not known. Most residents of the beach constructed their homes over several years.

All of the cottages in the town that were constructed prior to 1930 are important elements related to black town planning and design. It is important that these houses retain their originality in terms of plan design, lot orientation, interior decoration, and architectural aesthetics in order to preserve the concept of space and the dynamics of community development in this historic black town.


