The Lucas cottage is a gambrel roof colonial house in the historically black town of Highland Beach. It is frame construction and exhibits one of the few houses in the community that has a cement block, raised foundation. The house is an example of architectural planning and design by African-Americans during this era.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lucas cottage was a colonial inspired house with gambrel roof and shed roofed dormers. The house exhibits an elongated, enclosed porch which attempts to articulate the stick decorative elements established on several other houses in the community. The enclosed porch encircles three views and rests upon a cement block foundation which is atypical in this community.

Highland Beach, Maryland is a resort community that is located about ten miles south of Annapolis. The Lucas cottage is located on the block that is bounded by Bay Avenue to the north, Langston Avenue in the east, Douglass Avenue to the south, and Bruce Avenue on the west. The topography of the lot is covered with vegetation which consists of large trees, shrubs, wild flowers and grasses.

The eastern view of the house exhibits the principle place of entrance which is located at the top of a flight of six steps. The house is three bays wide at this view but the porch extends beyond the width of the house and is four bays wide. The screened porch is supported by boards and posts which accentuate the rectangularity of the facade. Vertical boards have also been constructed providing support for horizontal decorative strips that have been located under the eaves of the roof.

The second storey boasts one large dormer with a set of twin, double hung windows constructed of aluminum. The windows on the first floor are the original, multipaned casement type window. The house is finished with bevel siding and the roof shingles have been laid utilizing a brick bond pattern.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Highland Beach, Maryland is a historic black town that was founded by the son of Frederick Douglass. The town was conceived by Haley R. Douglass in the late nineteenth century to be a resort community for prominent blacks. Highland Beach is a unique existing reminder of town planning and architectural history as it relates to vernacular and high style design as exhibited by black people. Most of the architecture in Highland Beach is located on the original sites and building expansions were performed within a ten to fifteen year time frame. This provides us with a concise history of design, space planning, and architecture in a homogeneous, extant community

All of the cottages that were constructed prior to 1930 are important elements related to town planning and design. It is important that these houses retain their originality in terms of plan design, lot orientation, interior decoration, and architectural aesthetics in order to preserve the concept of space and the dynamics of community development in this historic black town.


