



Odenton quadrangle


18<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> centuries

This brick-walled cemetery was photographed during the c. 1970 research done on Brandy, the house which once stood nearby. A 1964 article states that several Warfield family members, their wives, and their children are interred in the cemetery.

The land upon which Brandy once stood was originally patented in 1683 by Richard Warfield, the first of the family in Anne Arundel County. In 1696 he became the first vestryman of St. Anne's Church in Annapolis. Brandy passed to Warfield's third son, Alexander, in 1703. When Alexander Warfield died in 1740, he devised this home seat referred to as "the dwelling plantation," to his youngest son, Richard, at the death of his mother. This Richard had two sons, Lancelot and Richard, Jr., to whom he left his estate. Lancelot bought out his brother's share, whereupon Richard Jr. moved to Frederick County. Lancelot left Brandy to his son, Lancelot, Jr., who left it to Lancelot Warfield III. This Lancelot sold the old homestead to a Mr. Gott. When Lancelot IV purchased Brandy back in 1882, it remained in the Warfield family until the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century.
