DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The present owner of the farm, to whose family the farm has belonged since the mid 19th century, said that this structure consists of 2^{five} houses that were moved from separate locations on the farm and joined together. The larger house (the one to the north) stood near Mrs. Wayson's house on the hill, while the smaller one was near the barns at a further distance.

Sheets of tin underpinning and red brick asphalt siding now sheathe the bottom and sides of the house and prevent an investigation of the construction. Inside, the original features are covered by modern materials, thus an investigation there was prohibited as well.

From what is observable the following can be gleaned: The larger house is a 3 bay, one story, (probably) frame house measuring 24' x 14'4". The smaller one is a 2 bay frame house with one story too (21' x 14'4"). Both houses have A roofs, but the pitch of the roof of the larger house is much steeper. This style suggests that his house was built c. 1850 or earlier, the other house being later.

The brick chimneys for wood stoves on each gable are 20th century, as indicated by the cement in the mortar. *And for manufactured bricks.*

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to the owner, family tradition held that these houses had once been slave cabins. This could well be true, especially for the earlier house.

The design and dimensions of each house are representative of mid 19th century slave cabins and of late 19th century and 20th century tenant farmers' houses.
