

Informant John Allyon [aged 86, son-in-law of one of the last owners] reported that the building was erected in 1898, based on the date cut into the top of a rafter (John Allyon, personal communication August 5, 2010). He had no photographs, but described the first floor as comprising two bedrooms flanking a central stair in the front, a large kitchen in the center, and a dining room and small bedroom in the back of the house. The small rear bedroom served for a while as a kitchen for his wife's grandmother. There were four rooms upstairs which he had never seen. The building had many windows and was heated with coal. A porch spanned the front (west) façade, wrapping around the south end of the building. In rural fashion, people entered through the kitchen. Although elevation views of the building are not currently available, Mr. Allyon's description suggests an unornamented farm house, large and somewhat rambling. The footprint suggests three episodes of construction, the front section perhaps the original, a simple two-story frame building with pairs of rooms above and below, with or without a cross gable. Interviews with Mr. Allyon suggest that the property owners were truck farmers, dealing in fruits and vegetables.


Relay 15' topographic quads
