Description:

This is a five bay wide, four story high, brick structure with granite trim. The first story entrances feature cornices with elaborate end brackets. Between floors on the facade there are rusticated and diamond brick patterns. Above the fifth floor there are diamond shaped brick and granite patterns. Directly above is the cornice with dentils and console modillions. The brick facade extends four feet above the cornice and extends higher in the center. Four of the windows on the building have decorative granite window surrounds and all the windows have granite ledges.



The building is located near the Courthouse Plaza and is compatible to the other government buildings within the square. The Courtside Building was originally called the Wolf Building and was built in August of 1918 to house law offices of Harry B. Wolf. The buildings features such details as elaborate cornices with end brackets, rusticated and diamond brick patterns between floors and an elaborate cornice with dentils and console modillions. The building presently contains law offices and it is in good condition. The Courtside Building makes a contribution to the historic character of the area.




