Description:

This is a three bay wide, three story high, rock faced stone structure with granite and aluminum trim. The first story has a central large, stone round arched window flanked by two granite entrances with small simple lintels above. On the left is a bright yellow awning which says Beehive. A simple cornice divides the first and second story and the second and third stories have three, eight over eight windows. There is a grotesque between the second and third floors in the center of the facade. The aluminum cornice at the roofline is painted brown and the building is in good condition.



The structure at 214 E. Lexington Street predates 1885 and was not damaged by the Baltimore Fire. In 1911 the building was occupied by the Oddfellows club and has changed hands several times throughout the 20th century. The front facade was altered significantly when a rock faced stone facade with granite and aluminum trim replaced the original facade. Overall the building is in good condition and adds to the historic character of the area.
