Description:

This is a small, one bay wide, three story high, brick and marble structure with stone and metal trim decoration. It has an altered storefront on the first story and the second and third stories feature large, three part windows, flanked by vertical bands of pearl molding. The transom area between the second and third story is decorated with a brown molded metal with floral designs. The cornice apparently has been removed, therefore the brick facade extends another four feet above the third story windows and the roofline is accented by a band of pearl molding.


Significance:

The little building at 24-26 East Fayette Street was designed in 1904 by the architect Henry J. Tinley and the builder was E.R. White. The first floor storefront has been altered and the upper stories feature molded metal with floral designs and intricate pearl molding. It appears as if the cornice at the roofline has been removed. If the cornice could be replaced and the storefront was brought back to its original condition the building could contribute to the historic character of the area.
