Description:

This small two story high rusticated brick building is defined by a central broken pediment above an arched window. The aluminum and glass entrance to the building is set into a heavy stone surround protected by Doric columns supporting a plain entablature. Above the entrance is a stone arch filled with a three part modern aluminum frame window. A pronounced keystone and gauged brick radiates above the arch. Above the stone base of the building flanking the entrance are boarded over windows with stone sills and splayed brick lintels. Similar windows are located on the second floor level. Flanking the arch are two large brackets supporting a massive broken pediment. The building ends with a brick parapet wall and stone coping.

This is one of the many excellent small banking houses within the Financial District. Designed by the noteworthy firm of Baldwin and Pennington, it features the classical design and symmetry of larger banks in the area. Although some alterations have taken place, the basic appearance of the building is intact and very similar to original illustrations of the design.



NEW BANKING-HOUSE OF HAMBLETON & CO.

Hambleton & Co. moved this afternoon into their new banking-house, 10 South Calvert street, and will open there for business on Monday. The new building occupies the site of the former home of this firm. The latter building was of recent construction, and before the fire was among the more handsome structures in the business section. The new building is of attractive design, with front of red pressed brick and terra cotta. It is one story high, and a feature is the liberal provision of space for each department of the firm. The general banking department occupies the front portion of the building. Behind this is the investment department, and the various special-wire facilities. At the rear are the private offices of the members of the firm. The ventilation and heating arrangements are in good order, and a series of skylights light the interior with natural light. Show baths and other luxuries that are some necessities in the proper equipment of a business building are supplied.
