



## Description:

The bronze statue of Cecil Calvert stands on a marble pedestal above a granite base on the Courthouse steps at Saint Paul Street. The front of the granite base has a cut letter inscription stating, "Erected under the auspices of the Society of Colonial Wars in the State of Maryland, November 21, 1908, DeCourcy Wright Thom being Governor of the Society." The front of the marble pedestal displays the State shield in relief and the inscription, "Cecilius Calvert 1606-1675." On the back of the pedestal is inscribed, "Cecilius Calvert, Baron Baltimore of Baltimore in the Land of Ireland, Absolute Lord and Proprietor of the Provinces of Maryland and Avalon in America, who on November 13, 1633 with the cooperation and assent of the Colonists proclaimed in England and on March 25, 1634 established the Palantinate of Maryland for the first time in the English speaking world freedom of religious worship according to any Christian form and separation of Church and State." The statue features Calvert, cavalier in appearance wearing the dress of the day with a cape and hat.



This is the only outdoor statue in honor of Cecilius Calvert in Baltimore. Calvert was the second Lord Baltimore, Lord Proprietor of Maryland from 1632-1675. He was the champion of three aspects of freedom in Maryland: freedom of religious worship, separation of Church and State, and the participation of freemen in making laws that he must obey. In the early twentieth century there was a controversy concerning the location of the Calvert Statue on the Courthouse steps. In reality, the statue partially obstructs the steps to the central Saint Paul Street entrance of the courthouse.
