Description:

This seven story high, seven bay wide modern building features a glass front with glass panels located between thin aluminum piers. The first floor features an entrance for the building, as well as a separate entrance for the automated teller machines and a night depository. A huge back-lit sign displays, "THE BANK OF BALTIMORE." The upper floor windows are divided by aluminum piers and glass panels at the floor levels.


Significance:

This modern bank building was built in 1961 conforming to the modern style of architecture that was to dominate Charles Center. Originally built for the First National Bank. It was later acquired by The Savings Bank of Baltimore, now known as the Bank of Baltimore. This structure, the Hansa Haus and the annex to the Bank of Baltimore headquarters at Charles and Baltimore Streets provides administrative office space for this bank. The Bank of Baltimore has retained its historically significant main building, unlike other banks that have torn down significant structures for new high rise bank buildings in the Financial District.


