Description:

This two story high structure has been severely altered and joined with the building at 34 South Calvert Street to house Martinique, a discoteque. All of the openings on the building have been covered over. The second floor features egg and dart molding, decorated with a central cartouche and a large cornice decorated with elaborate end brackets. The building is in fair condition.


Significance:

Area: architecture

The structure at 32 South Calvert Street has been combined with 34 South Calvert Street to form one building. This building was designed in 1905 by George B. Clothier as a separate building. The first story has been totally defaced and is without any door or windows. On the second story the window space has been bordered up. The building does have some significant architectural details such as a large central cartouche, egg and dart molding and a heavy cornice embellished with elaborate end brackets. The building is in fair condition and if it could be restored to its original appearance it could contribute to the historical character of the area.




Baltimore Financial District Survey


