Description: This is a one bay wide, five story high, granite structure with aluminum trim. The first story has been significantly altered with a large storefront window and a double door entrance with a segmentally arched transom window above. A cornice divides the first and second story with geometric styled end brackets. The second through the fourth stories have three part, three over three windows. At the fourth story there is an elaborate balcony embellished with end brackets and an iron railing. Above the fourth story windows there are stone voussoirs with a keystone console. On the fifth story there are three, centralized one over one windows. The building is without a cornice and it is in good condition.



This building was designed by the architectural firm of Wyatt & Nolting in 1905 and is still in good condition. The building features a large segmental arch and a cornice with elaborate end brackets. In addition, the building features a decorative balcony embellished with end brackets and an iron railing. There are stone voussoirs and keystone consoles accenting some windows. This building contributes to the historic character of the area.
