Description:

This is a nine bay wide, three story high, including the basement, brick structure with granite trim. There is a pedimented main entrance in the southwestern corner. The first, second and third stories have one over one windows decorated with keystone consoles and window ledges of Indiana limestone. There is a wood cornice embellished with modillions and egg and dart molding. The north elevation is two bays wide and there are entrances at both elevations to the basement.




The building at the corner of St. Paul and East Saratoga was built c. 1907-1908 by the Engineering Contracting Company and was designed by Morris and Clifford. The building was built for the law firm of Henninghausen and Stein. The building is in good condition and features a pedimented main entrance, windows decorated with keystone consoles and a wood cornice embellished with modillions and egg and dart molding. Presently the building is undergoing renovations to be used as law offices. Overall the building contributes to the historic character of the area.


