Description:

This is a three bay wide, 3½ story high, vacant, Flemish bond brick structure with a gabled roof and dormer. There is a main entrance in the northwestern corner of the front facade decorated with a heavy keystone elaborate surround with a decorative lintel, end brackets, console modillions and a fanlight window above the wooden door. There is another entrance in the center of the first floor which was apparently created from a former window opening. All of the windows have been removed, although the openings are extant. A simple wood cornice with some cable molding surmounts the third floor and there is a small dormer window on the roof. Overall the building is in fair condition.




The vacant structure at 105 E. Saratoga Street was built in the early nineteenth century. The building has some significant architectural details such as, a heavy elaborate lintel above the main entrance, end brackets, console modillions and a fanlight window above the wooden door. In addition, the simple wood cornice has some cable molding. This is one of the earliest extant buildings in the area and represents the type of house that once was common throughout the Financial District area. Most of these buildings were either altered severely, torn down for newer and larger buildings or destroyed in the Baltimore Fire.


