DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building is five bays wide, two stories high, has running bond building and foundation walls and a flat roof.

From the left, the first story facade is punctuated by an air vent; a flat, fixed, single light window with stone sill and brick lintel; a flat wood door that surmounts a stone stoop. The door, nearly in the center of the facade, is encased in an unpretentious wood surround and has a brick lintel. The door is contiguous to the wood enframing for a two part picture window that spans the remainder of the facade. Both windows are fixed, flat, and share a wood sill. They are divided by a piece of wood paneling. The window closer to the door is of sixteen lights, while the other is of thirty-two lights.

The second story facade is punctuated by five symmetrically organized flat, double hung windows with one over one lights, stone sills, and brick lintels. The windows are identical in structure and the lintel forms a course the length of the facade. Then above this lintel is a slightly projecting painted wood cornice surmounted by a shallow running bond parapet wall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The syntactical relationship of the building entrances and the streets onto which they enter refers to a heirarchy of street organization. The block's two largest buildings face Mt. Royal Avenue, and have dominant entrances on that street. The heirarchical importance of Mt. Royal is signified by its being wider than the other streets bounding this block. An important referent in this regard is the use of Mt. Royal as a major link to Druid Hill Park. The subordinate streets apparently shared the same relative importance. That is Earl Court has dominant entrances on Preston and St. Paul Streets, and the row of houses facing Preston Street is linked to Calvert Street by way of the corner house having its only entrance facing Calvert.


