DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building is four bays wide and one story high with common bond building walls and stone foundation walls.

From the left: The first bay is articulated by two identical recessed arches defined by molded brick detailing. The arches are both echoed in their interior space by contiguous fanlight transom that surmount flat tripartite windows. The larger central section of both windows has been boarded over, while the narrower four light sections flanking them have remained open to light. The windows rest on brick sills.

The next bay is relieved by a shallow wall niche (defined by brick molding) to the left of a wood garage door. The door opens vertically and has six lights. These two elements share a narrow painted wood cornice that is contiguous to the door and window treatment of the bays to be described later. Two round arches inset with fanlights form transoms surmounting the cornice. The arches and fanlights are identical to those previously described.

The next bay houses a flat wood door with narrow windows flanking it to either side. These elements are set into a shallow recession like those housing the windows in the first bays. The door has a wood lintel surmounted by the continuous cornice from the previous bay. Again, the arch and fanlight element, centered over the door, punctuates the facade over the cornice.

The last bay is punctuated by a large, flat plate glass window with a stone sill and wood lintel (like that one over the door). The painted wood cornice continues above the lintel and terminates at the end of the window. Two arches, like the others, punctuate the facade above the cornice. The arch to the left is boarded over, the other arch and fanlight are identical to those previously described.


