DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 3½ story building is located in midblock, but is the left end of an extremely attractive group of 5 Queen Anne rowhouses. Though the houses are of 3 different types, and each uses several contrasting materials and many different sizes and shapes of windows, together they form a harmonious composition. The 5 houses are related in the way the materials are handled, the common window levels, band course, and roof lines.

This house is surfaced in random rock cut ashlar granite and has brick trim. The high basement and 1st floor have 3 bays. There is a stoop with 8 stairs parallel to the wall on the left. One basement bay is a grilled window and the other (right) a pair of low doors. There is a transom over the pair of exterior doors. The inner vestibule door is to the left with a leaded sidelight on its right. Above is a decorative brick band course. All the windows except those in the dormers have stone sills and most have stone lintels as well.

There is a 2 story segmentally arched shallow recess just right of center on the facade. It is surfaced in brick. There is a 3 sided slightly protruding bay with one-over-one windows (one central wide one with 2 very narrow side panels) on the second floor. A small square single pane window set high in the wall is to the left. There are 2 one-over-one windows within the recess on the 3rd floor. The bay window and these two windows each have a splayed brick lintel. There is a panel of basket weave brickwork between the floors. Another square window, this time with a pair of 2 panel casements and set low is to the left.

The steeply sloped asbestos shingled front portion of roof is visible. There is a dwarf bulbous turret with a conical roof to the extreme left. Its lower portion of granite bulges from the surface of the wall. A large dormer, whose front is a continuation of the stone facade is over the brick recessed bay. The peak is partially hipped, and molding similar to the plain cornice rims the edges. There is a paladian window in this dormer with brick trim. The central window, like the one in the turret is one-over-one, and the narrow side panels are single panes.






