DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

There is a narrow alley to the right of this 3 story, 3 bay building of painted brick with flat roof. The lower floor has been extensively remodeled .

There is a base of long bricks, laid so that the vertical joints form continuous lines. The first floor is framed by bands of painted wood on the sides and top. There is an entrancerecess to the right, approached by 2 steps. One solid door is on its rear wall, the other door a glass and wood one, is on the angled left side wall. Most of the first floor is surfaced in glass block, which forms a rounded edge at the recess.

The upper floor windows are one-over-one double hung with splayed brick lintels and stone sills. There is a deeply molded cornice, which displays its profile where it turns both cornices of the building.


