DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This white painted brick building with blue trim occupies the obtuse corner of Tyson and Read Streets. It is three stories high with a partially hipped roof.

The Read Street facade of two bays has a shopfront at ground level which consists of a door to the left with stone sills and a plate glass window ornamented with a picket fence at its bottom edge. There is a blue scalloped awning over door and window, whose top edge is immediately under a thin cornice. The 2nd floor windows are 6-over-6 and those on the 3rd floor are 3-over-3 with wood blinds. Both types have wood sills and splayed brick lintels.

The roof line and brick cornice courses of this building are identical to those of the houses adjacent to it on Tyson Street. The window placement and sizing is slightly different though. The Tyson Street facade is of three bays, two grouped to the left and one close to the corner. On the first floor there are (from left to right) a one-over-one window with brick sill, a door with a transom and a narrow single pane shop window with blue awning and a lower panel of wood. The shop window and door have stone sills and the other window has a brick sill. All the apertures on this facade have wood lintels and all those above the first floor have wood sills as well. The second floor has 2-6-over-6 windows to the left. On the right is a much taller French window, each panel having 10 panes of glass in 2 vertical rows. The third floor has 3-over-3 windows similar to those on Read Street, but only the right one has wood blinds.

The back building of this house, with a latticed rail on the second floor is visible from Read Street. Another unusual feature is a curve in the rear wall where it joins the Read Street facade.





