DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

501-509 N. Howard Street is two buildings, 501-503 and 507-509, visually unified on the first story facade by extensive remodeling. Both buildings are three stories high. Because their first story facades appear to be one, they will be described as such:

The foundation and first story building walls are resurfaced in black rectangular tiles. Five bays face Howard Street. From the left, there are three large plate glass store windows punctuating the facade. To the right of these, flat double doors of plate glass framed in aluminum with a flat plate glass aluminum framed window to either side and a flat plate glass transom with aluminum framing are recessed into a shallow, oblique entrance at approximately the center of the Howard Street facade. To the right of this entrance another large, flat plate glass store window punctuates the facade. A tripartite flat plate glass store window follows the curved building wall onto Franklin Street so that one flat planed section faces Howard Street, one faces Franklin Street, and the curved surfade pa ne faces the corner. The Franklin Street facade is divided into three bays defined by three large, flat plate glass store windows. All the plate glass windows have grooved aluminum lintels and aluminum sills.

The second and third story facades of 501-503, a corner building, are of brick. Five bays face Howard Street, one bay faces the corner, and six bays face Franklin Street. All windows are double hung with one over one lights. The windows punctuating the second story facade are flat, while the windows punctuating the third story facade are full arched. Fenestration is arranged in a way to allow one flat and one arched window to rest in a slightly redessed, fully arched column. This columnation of fenestration is common to all the windows except the vertical window arrangement to the extreme left in the Howard Street facade. The column created by these two windows punctuates a shallowly projecting end bay. All the windows have stone sills and brick lintels. Decorative brickwork embellishes the walls between the bays on the second story facade, while rustication decorates the second story facade. Dentals are carried across the entire facade by a cornice surmounted by a modest balustrade. The roof is flat.

The second and third story facades of 507-509 N. Howard Street are four bays wide and made of stone. Fenestration is symetrical, and the roof is flat. The cornice is supported by brackets at either end. Four identical windows punctuate either story facade. The windows are flat tripartite casements, with the center light being the largest. All the windows are surmounted by tripartite transoms, also with the largest light at the center. All sills and lintels are stone.





Baltimore City iMap image, 2006
