DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The facade of this 3 story, mid-block building has been totally remodeled. The glass entrance door, transom and four paned shop window are set in a single plane at a small angle to the street. Thus the door reached by 3 concrete stairs is more deeply recessed than the window. There is an area triangular in plan in front of the window which is a planter. The front of the planter and the narrow flanking portions of wall are surfaced with red painted vertical boards.

The upper 2 floors of the facade is treated as a single surface totally covered in grooved aluminum. A mitered band of the aluminum forms a frame for the central panel which is horizontally striated. Only "514" in red enameled numerals just above the shop front relieves this bland surface.



