**Description:** The three-bay facade remains largely as built about 1830-32. The flemish bond brickmasonry is painted tan and the wood door and window trim is dark brown. Other than the arched door surround with its recessed panel pilasters and plain hood cornice, there is no ornamentation on the facade. The recessed doorway has a fanlight. The base of the elevation is faced with stone and the windows have stone sills and flat gauged brick arches. The 6/6 windows are slightly recessed and have no trim. The cornice has a flat fascia and simple box. A single dormer is centered in the gable roof with an arched 6/6 window. A bronze plaque between the ground floor windows reads as follows: "In this house, then the home of J.H.B. Latrobe, there was awarded in October 1833 to Edgar Allan Poe, the Baltimore Saturday Visiter's (correct spelling) Short Story Prize, which brought him recognition as a writer of prose. Erected 1955 by the Edgar Allan Poe Society of Baltimore." A second historical marker sponsored by private citizens regarding this event is scheduled for placement in June 1985.

**Significance:**

Area: architecture, literature

Level: local

The award of the Saturday Visiter prize to Edgar Allan Poe in the Latrobe House gave him the immediate local attention which resulted in his eventual employment by a Richmond newspaper and widespread interest in his subsequent literary works. The house was owned by Latrobe, the son of the architect Benjamin H. Latrobe, from its construction until the mid-1850's. During his residence there, he designed the portico for the Basilica of the Assumption. Adopted in 1841, the foundations were laid, but the portico itself was not completed until 1865, to an enlarged and modified design by Eben Fazon. The Latrobe House is one of a row of three early 19th century houses on Mulberry Street which retained much of their original architectural character. The Latrobe House facade is the least altered of the three.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

11 West Mulberry, lot 5, is an attached house of common bond brick with a brick watertable and a gabled roof, with a dormer window. The first story has 2 rectangular windows, 3x5 panes with wooden sills and brick flat arched lintels. The door has a transom, a full arched opening, no vestibule, and is flanked by wooden pilasters. There is a wooden ~~XX~~ cornice over the door, and a fan window below that. The second floor has three bays, three windows, 3x4 panes, with wooden sills and flat arched lintels. The third floor is the same as the second. There is a brick chimney ~~on~~ the left of the roof.

The back is of common bond brick. On the first and second stories a wooden porch protrudes from the extension. It is half the size in length and width. There is a door on the first story on the right. A central window with 3x4 panes is on the second story, and on the third story there is a window with one pane. All the windows have flat arched brick lintels and wooden sills.




