DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This row of seven mid-block, gable-roofed rowhouses are each 2 bays wide and 2½ stories high. Slight variations distinguish each; brief descriptions follow:

416 W. Mulberry:

Surfaced in formstone.

4 stone steps to flat-transomed door in right bay.

Picture window with double flat transom in left ground floor bay.

Double-hung (6/6 lights) windows with formstone sills and lintels in second story.

Peaked, centered dormer (double-hung, 6/6 lights)

418 W. Mulberry:

Surfaced in formstone.

2 brick steps to segmentally-arched transomed door in left bay.

Picture window with segmental-arched transom in right ground floor bay.

Stone foundation with double cellar window

Boarded second story windows, peaked dormer.

420 W. Mulberry:

Similar to 416 W. Mulberry, with the following exceptions:

- 1). segmental-arched cellar windows on left.
- 2). No transom over picture window.

422 W. Mulberry:

Surfaced in painted running-bond brick.

3 stone steps to door on left (no transom)

Picture window on right with flat transom, boarded.

Cornice spans entire first floor.

Patterend brick foundation; single flat cellar window.

Upper story windows, dormer boarded.

424 W. Mulberry:

Similar to 418 W. Mulberry, with the following exceptions:

- 1). Multi-paned window in place of picture window.
- 2). Door on right, with flat transom and five cement steps.

426 W. Mulberry:

Ground floor, surface similar to 422 W. Mulberry.

Wood sills, flat-arch brick lintels on second story.

All windows, dormer, boarded.
