Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

The Bressler Memorial Laboratory is a six-story, oblong Art Deco medical school building, clad in common-bond brick with limestone and concrete trim. It faces west on S. Greene St. and is closely surrounded by older university buildings. It consists of a four-story, seven-bay-wide main block, surmounted by a narrower two-story, five-bay-wide upper section. Windows throughout the building are modern one-over-one dark metal sash windows with infilled transom panels. The building is 18 bays deep, running east from S. Greene St. The front of the main block is clad primarily in brick and features a two-story recessed center entrance bay, flanked by inset round astylar columns. The recessed double doors have a stone-faced surround. A wide stone belt course occupies the entire space between the tops of the second floor windows and entrance bay and the sills of the third floor windows. This course wraps around the side of the building. The dates 1807-1939 are carved in Roman numerals in the belt course above the entrance. The top of the fourth floor is marked by another wide stone belt course. The two top floors are faced entirely with stone and the windows in each of its bays are united by vertical recesses. The verticality is enhanced by carved vertical grooves between the upper and lower windows. The flat-roofed building has a shallow-pitched gable-pediment parapet at the top with scallop-shell ornamental finials crowning the center peak and each end of the pediment.

The sides of the four-story main block have a twelve-bay center section flanked at each end by projecting three-bay corner "pavilions." The walls are clad in brick with wide stone belt courses as seen on the front. The upper two floors, which are stepped back from the lower four floors, are clad in stone and have a slightly projecting twelve-bay center section with three-bay end sections.

The 1938 Bulletin of the UMD School of Medicine mentioned that a new medical school building was to be erected to house most of the preclinical departments, and would be complete by the fall of 1939. This building was the Bressler Memorial Laboratory, and would allow ample space for the preclinical branches to function independently from the clinical branches of the medical school. It was named in honor of Dr. Frank C. Bressler, who had seen patients at University Hospital and left the medical school \$1 million upon his death in 1935, which was intended to provide research facilities. The designer of the building is unknown. It was completed in 1939. By 1988, another building at 655 W. Baltimore Street had been erected and named for Bressler. The former Bressler building no longer bears its original name, and its current use is unclear. The 1988 campus map referred to it as the Greene Street Building.

The Bressler Memorial Laboratory is a solid but not overly impressive example of a 1930s municipal Art Deco building, and does not have a particularly distinguished history. Though it retains integrity and is associated with the 1930s expansion of university and hospital facilities in the surrounding blocks, this was not a significant-enough event to meet NRHP Criterion A. It does not appear to meet any other NRHP criteria on an individual basis and is recommended not individually eligible. However, it would be a contributing element to the proposed University of Maryland Medical School-Hospital District (B-5128).

The Bressler Memorial Laboratory is a six-story tall brick structure organized into a tripartite horizontal composition. A two-story recessed entrance occurs in the two central bays of the main (west) facade. Flanking the doorway are monumental, elliptically-shaped columns of poured concrete with a smooth surface treatment, double-wing sashed windows with projecting, poured concrete sills. Other notable decorative features of the facade include: a wide, poured concrete belt course separating the central zone from the top level; the central first bay unit with 2 story high fluted pilasters which rise from the top of the belt course to the bottom of the poured concrete blank frieze; and a pediment adorned with a projecting smooth-surfaced tympanum and three stylized, floral patterned finials.

The Bressler Building designed by Herbert G. Gisp and James R. Edmunds, Jr., is a good example of Art Deco architecture characterized by its geometric, hard-edge composition of its main facade with restrained, stylized ornamentation.

 DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Bressler Memorial Laboratory Building (29 South Greene Street) located on the west side of South Greene Street between West Lombard and West Redwood Streets is a six storey tall brick structure organized into a tripartite horizontal composition.

A vertical emphasis is achieved at the highest level (third storey) through a pedimented stepped facade.

A two storey recessed entrance is found in the two central bays of the main (west) facade. Flanking the doorway are monumental elliptically-shaped columns of poured concrete with a smooth surface treatment, double hung sashed windows with projecting poured concrete sills. These define the remaining four bays of both the first and second storeys. This seven bay, two storey unit is distinguished from an identical unit above by a wide poured concrete belt course.

The third and fourth storeys are identical. Double hung, sashed windows with projecting, poured concrete sills define each of the corresponding openings.

A wide poured concrete belt course separates the central zone from the top level. In contrast to the levels below, this section is reduced by two bays and displays a poured concrete veneer. This central five bay unit is distinguished by fluted vertical pilasters which rise from the top of the belt course to the bottom of the poured concrete blank frieze. These two storey pilasters are crowned by a narrow fluted abacus.

Double hung sashed windows of the fifth and sixth storeys are separated by a tripartite stone panel.

A projecting smooth-surfaced tympanum and three stylized, floral-patterned finials adorn the pediment.

Although the classroom and laboratory facilities show little sign of remaining interior detailing, the main lobby displays a wealth of typical Art Deco ornamentation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Bressler Memorial Laboratory Building is a good example of Art Deco architecture characterized by its geometric, hard-edge composition of its main facade with restrained, stylized ornamentation.

In a neighborhood survey performed by the Baltimore Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (the city's official historic preservation office) during the mid-1970's, the building is described as an "excellent example of modern styling modeled after and mimicking the entrance facade of the earlier University of Maryland Hospital (1933-1934)."

The building, designed by Herbert G. Crisp and James R. Edmunds, Jr., was constructed in 1937 on the site of the old Emmanuel Lutheran Church. Funding for its construction was provided in the estate of Frank Bressler (totalling \$280,000.00) and supplemented by the Work Program Administration.

Currently, the Bressler Memorial Laboratory is used by the University of Maryland as classroom and laboratory facilities.







DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Bressler building is a six story brick and stone detailed structure executed in modern styling. The building is an "H" in plan, with four story high corner "legs". The brick is laid in common bond.

The building is seven bays wide. The windows are double hung with three-over-three lights, with flat brick lintels and stone sills. The main entrance is centered at ground level and is recessed. It rises two stories high, supported on undetailed stone columns at either side of the opening. Rounded stone piers flank the entranceway which is filled with aluminum and plate glass double doors with transom. A wide, flat stone belt course runs above the second story level, supported on the columns, ~~covered~~ **CARVED** Modern lettering above the entrance identifies the building.

A wide stone belt course runs above the fourth level. The top two floors are five bays wide, centered above the belt course. Black stone panels separate the fifth and sixth floor windows. Two story fluted stone pilasters separate the bays. A shallow stone pediment is backed by a parapet above the sixth story. Carved anthemion rise at the ends and center of the parapet. A caduceus in relief is centered on the face of the pediment.

The sides of the building are 18 bays deep, with a twelve bay deep, six story high central portion and three bay deep, four story high ends. Handing of the windows is identical to that on the front. The courses of stone are continued on the sides, except that at the third floor level returns only on the four story "legs". A two story high penthouse is on the flat roof.

A landscaped walkway parallels the building on the north; a parking lot is behind the building; a narrow concrete alley is wide enough to accommodate pedestrians and fire escapes on the south.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Bressler building is an excellent example of Modern styling. Modeled after, and mimicking the entrance facade of the earlier University of Maryland Hospital (1933-34, Herbert G. Grispi and James R. Edmunds Jr.) the buildings together record the first break of a prominent Baltimore institution with classically inspired architectural models, clarifying the growth of the acceptance of Modern architecture in Baltimore.
