

Notable features:

Seriously run-down, long terrace of post-Civil War speculative housing. The proportions of the facade are heavy for the width of the lots (15'1" to 13') but they present a grand effect as a terrace. The sidewalk is too narrow for the height of the facades. There are several round-headed doorways, and the second floor porch on the rear of 329 N. Schroeder is picturesque.



Environmental context:
