Notable features:

Numbers 800 and 802 are gabled houses with dormers, early for this area and should remain because they are good examples of their type, have nice scale and relate to the domestic character of Poe Homes across Saratoga from them. Number 804 is of later date, another style and formstoned, but with the even later 806-810, should be rehabilitated.

Even if the big property once occupied by Amrhein's Bakery is used for another purpose -- such as a large apartment house -- these houses should stay.


Number 800 is a triangular building; 802 Saratoga has a promenade porch on Fremont Avenue.

Environmental context:  
Numbers 800, 802, and 808 are vacant. These houses are opposite the Baptist Church (across Saratoga Street) and form a nice counterpoint to it. Saratoga needs street trees.
