

Environmental context:

All vacant except one (254); faces P. S. No. 161 and construction of new recreation center. As an architectural environmental element for this neighborhood, these houses should be kept, rehabilitated and occupied. The street could be narrowed, trees planted and sidewalk widened, and the street stopped at Born Court.
