Notable features:


Builders' speculative housing. Notable because 1073-1069 are set so low, shallow flights of steps, no foundation delineation. All have wooden sills. Most of this group date just before or just after the Civil War. Flat roofs also indicate relatively late date. Numbers 1079 and 1073 are narrow houses. Number 1067 has iron work and original doorway. Numbers 1063, 1073 and 1079 also have original doorways. Number 1065 has been form-stoned and number 1081 has been crudely stocced.

Environmental context:

Lots at 1075-77 are cleared and number 1069 is vacant. Wide, busy street, needs trees; gaps should probably remain open.
