Notable features:

Numbers 1003, 1005 and 1007 are narrow, early houses, c. 1852. Number 1001 is of the same date. Number 1011 has been form-stoned but has nice iron work above its original store front. Numbers 1001 and 1003 have been stuccoed. The east wall of 1001 is in hazardous way, and the front walls of 1003 and 1007 are also very bad.



Should all be rehabilitated, completing the terrace.
