Notable features:


St. Luke's Church, originally Fourth Presbyterian (1858), address "Baltimore west of Fremont." By 1864 its address is "South side of Franklin Square." Architect unknown.

A pleasant addition to the Square. Architecturally undistinguished but typical; of stone. Presently in use as a Lutheran church.

Number 1307 is a freestanding house, brownstone and brick, bow window, in good condition. The style is typical of the 1880's.

Environmental context:

Forms south edge of Franklin Square and as such is important to the area. On a very busy, noisy, one-way street, but has nice street trees at this point.
