
Notable features:

Until after 1885 there was a long wall along the north side of Fayette Street except at the 1001-1005 corner, shielding the George Page Steam Engine Saw and Grist Mills. It was torn down after 1885 and these houses were built. They do not have back buildings. The row has a wooden cornice, tall marble steps and some elaborate doorways, with tall, round-headed filigree windows, segmental window arches and wood sills; some box shutters remain. Numbers 1009, 1023 and 1027 are formstoned.

The completeness of this terrace along with its good condition, good scale and variety make it worthy of special commendation, perhaps landmark designation.

Environmental context:

There are no vacancies or gaps. The significant architectural continuity of the houses contributes to the urbanity of the street scene. Both the house-to-house and across-street scale is excellent. Street is one-way, busy and noisy. Tiny street trees are in; larger ones are needed.
