Notable features:

The terrace appears on the 1876 map as buildings only at 5 and 7. Number 7 is a hip roof, 2½ story house with flat window arches and attic windows. Its roof style and general proportions indicate that it is probably an earlier house. The infill building on its south side is much later.

Environmental context:



