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

Notable features:

Number 858 is an early stable -- 1830's. The brick is laid in Flemish bond, the only building spotted with this brickwork in the area. In its present ruinous condition it seems beyond repair; from the appearance of the east side of the roof, it extended over the adjacent lot at 856. Number 860 is an early house of 1840-1845. Number 862 is a set-back garage.

Environmental context:


Lot 179 at 856 W. Fairmount has been cleared. These are across-street from equally small houses, so are in good scale if a rehabber could be found for both.






