
Notable features:

These small houses 4 and 6 may be dated accurately from tax records. The one at number 8 has been demolished, but 4 and 6 are among the older buildings in the area. They are now derelict -- perhaps beyond rehabilitation -- though they are in no worse shape than some were in Sterling Street. If at all possible, they should, with number 2 which is a more recent building, be rehabilitated. This recommendation is made despite acknowledgement that the construction of the school and play yard and the commercial uses of Baltimore Street have these buildings isolated and out of domestic context. Numbers 6 and 4 might be thrown together with the lot at number 8 used as a garden. A (store front) church utilizes the ground floor of number 2 and it is in



