DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small, clapboard cottage is set on a random-stone base. The picturesque facade, painted coffee with red detailing, features louvered shutters, attenuated porch supports and corbelled roof braces below the eaves. Of particular interest is the Palladian window in the porch pediment. The semi-circular central window has been altered by an air-conditioner unit in the central section, which is mounted by a fanlight. On either side is a casement window with 2/2 lights. Four gables in the shingle roof complete <sup>A</sup>interplay of texture and color. <sub>THE</sub>

Three brick steps with brick side walls lead to the brick front porch. A wooden enframing holds the wooden door behind an aluminum screen door. On either side of the entrance are panels mounted by 2/2 lights. A glass transom caps the entire grouping. Two conical porch lights flank the enframing. To the left are two rectangular windows with 6/1 lights, wood sills and lintels, and louvered shutters.

Three tripartite windows fill each facade of the left wing with two, rectangular double hung windows of 1/1 lights flanked by a fixed central light. Wooden mullions separate the windows enframed by wood.

A secondary mid-section gable rises behind the front pediment. A corbelled brick to the left of this gable chimney saddles the roof.

**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Built in the early or mid-nineteen twenties, this house is representative of the true Bungalow style, ~~is~~ <sup>which is</sup> typically small and one-storied, with a window in the gable.

The Bungalow was most popular in the 1st quarter of the 20th century. Second generation bungalows had full 2nd stories with true living rooms and wide front porches. Such dwellings are common in Ashburton and throughout Baltimore.


